Grant Funding

- **Grant Cycle Dates:** Opens in May and closes in July each year.
- **Eligibility:** Qualified 501(c)(3) organizations or government entities serving Carroll County, Grayson County, and the City of Galax, dedicated to supporting and furthering TCCF's mission.
- **Community Impact:** Grants fund projects that support our mission and create lasting, positive change across the Twin Counties.



Scholarships

- **Full-Tuition Scholarships:** Available to eligible high school graduates from Carroll, Galax, and Grayson to attend Wytheville Community College (covers tuition & fees after all financial aid & other scholarships are applied).
- **Annual \$1,000 Scholarships:** Three scholarships awarded—one each for a student from Galax, Carroll, and Grayson County. Can be used at any college or university of the recipient's choice.
